

EQUIPMENT OPERATOR

NATURE OF WORK

This is manual work in the operation of automotive equipment used in street maintenance and construction, park maintenance and construction, street cleaning, stormwater maintenance and construction and solid waste collection as applicable. Employee may be required to operate a variety of equipment, to perform laboring duties, and use heavy earth moving equipment occasionally. Supervision is received from the Field Supervisor II and/or Foreman who assigns and inspects work in progress.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Operates a variety of vehicles used in the collection and transportation of solid wastes, brush truck tractor, and other equipment relative to grounds maintenance and construction; operates other automotive equipment on a trainee, temporary, or emergency basis; follows standard safety precautions in the operation of the equipment; performs minor maintenance and routine housekeeping on the assigned piece of equipment; performs other duties as assigned.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

Knowledge of traffic rules and regulations; knowledge of the operation of trucks and other light automotive equipment; ability to operate trucks, tractors, other light automotive equipment, and/or various cleaning equipment; ability to make minor repairs and adjustments to equipment; ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions; sufficient physical strength and agility and freedom from disabling defects to do heavy manual labor.

Training and Experience

Graduation from a standard high school or GED; one (1) year experience in the operation of trucks, tractor or other light automotive equipment and/or job related equipment other than automotive. Desire background in the construction field.

Valid Florida CDL, Class B
